We explored which type of plastic would make a good shield for our castles, a plastic bag or a plastic box lid. We concluded that the plastic box lid was a better shield because it is hard.



Holly Class

Another busy two weeks have passed and we have crammed in lots! In English we have been continuing our text Escape from Pompeii, writing settings of both the pre eruption and post eruption of Vesuvius. We realised how this was an emotive piece of writing to do and we had to really use the skill of empathy to even start to imagine what it is like to leave everything behind and your home being destroyed. We have written postcards about the History Man visit which the children loved and they learned so much. He had many objects and artefacts to explore and he made it very interactive, it was great fun!



In history we continued to learn about the Army and their equipment. We also looked at Britain before the Romans invaded and found out about hill forts. We used our art time to make our real shields and these will be ready for after half term when we become Holly Class Roman Army.



In maths we have continued to explore place value; Roman Numerals in Year 4 which was actually rather complicated and partitioning bigger numbers in Year 3. We have been making time to practice number bonds and timetables too. In drama, the children have designed their own Roman God and this week had to design their costume. They will be using these to create their own stories.



In science we used chocolate to

learn about the Rock Cycle. We made sedimentary, metamorphic and igneous rocks, messy but fun!



Silver Birch Class

We have been using our Shackleton themed interplaylands to help us add detail to our writing. We have been writing diaries from the point of view of our crew characters and trying to make them as realistic and historically accurate as possible. Making our interplayland allowed us to think about the small details aboard the ship - and hopefully show this in our writing! In maths, we have been focusing on calculations with year 5 looking at addition and subtraction and year 6 looking at more efficient strategies for multiplication.

We have finished Holes and have thoroughly enjoyed finding out how it all ties together in a very satisfying ending. We may watch the film version at some point and see how it compares! We have continued to investigate reversible and irreversible changes in science particularly looking at how salty water can be made drinkable through evaporation and condensation. Something that Shackleton's crew may have needed to consider! We decided it wasn't a very efficient approach and are hopefully now more grateful for our fresh, clean water.

In RE we have had lots of fruitful discussions about religion – what role it plays in our lives, how people with different beliefs can disagree and find common ground with atheists and considered how we would define ourselves.
