Willow Class

In Willow Class this week we have moved on to Castles and Castle models from 3d bricks. We made our own versions of Paul Klee's The Castle. We read books by David Melling, like The Kiss That Missed and Good Knight Sleep Tight and sequenced the story. We painted our Mini-Mes and worked on our fine motor skills, including holding pencils well, threading, pinching and writing our names. We have talked about our school rules and values and played games to encourage turn taking, listening and learning names. In maths we have been practising counting conkers and matching them to written numbers.



Beech Class

Beech class have continued to develop a love of learning though our topic Castles, Knights and


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Dragons. In history we have been looking at William the Conqueror and the castles he helped build. Furthermore, we recreated the battle of Hastings and took on the daring roles of the Anglo-Saxons and the Normans. Can you believe the Norman's won! We are very excited to meet the history man next week.



In maths, we have been exploring the 'greater than' 'less than' and 'equal to' symbols. Miss Taylor helped us remember by saying that the 'crocodile always eats the bigger number because he is hungry!'.



In English, we have been listening to the story 'Small Knight and George and the Royal Chocolate Cake'. We put ourselves in the story and changed the stories dessert to our favourites. These included, cake mixed with ice cream, chocolate fingers and Oreos!

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Holly Class

Holly Class have continued to find out lots of interesting facts about the Romans.

In English we have been continuing our text Escape from Pompeii. We have acted as the characters in Pompeii before the Gentle Protector erupted. We have also been trying to write 50 word story starters, really focusing on language and effective vocabulary.



In history we learned about the Roman Army and how the Army were a key factor in the Romans being so successful in ruling their Empire. Ask the children what the 5 most important factors were.

In math's we have continued to explore place value, exploring numbers to 1000 and beyond. We have been using lots of different equipment such as union and base 10. We have been playing mental math's

games to help us learn our times tables and number bonds.



In computing we have learned about digital devices and we had to sort objects into whether they were digital or not. We also had to design our own digital device that incorporated several components that act as an input, process and output. These were components like lights, microphone, a switch and a screen. I was really impressed with the children's' designs!



Silver Birch Class

We have been racing through Holes – our class reader. We are showing excellent inferences and enjoying lots of discussions about the characters and the plot. In English, we have been reading 'Shackleton's Journey' and learning about the trip across the Antarctic. We are using drama to record our thoughts and feelings in role – which will help us write more diary entries as crew members. We have also planned out our first interplayland making a replica of Shackleton's ship – with each of us choosing a section of the boat we want to remake in detail. We are also hoping this will help us add lots of detail to our writing. In science we have been investigating mixing solvents and solutes (water + salt) and finding the saturation point. In maths, we have been working solidly on place value and

rounding, the Year 6s have now moved on to calculations. Year 6s have enjoyed Bikeability and are in the process of applying for their leadership roles.
