In Maths, we have been naming, describing and using 2d shapes in maths and counting to 5. In Music, we have been listening and appreciating music and following the beat. We have been on an Autumn Walk and looked for Seasonal Changes. We made Poppies and talked about Remembrance Day. We marked Remembrance Day by visiting the churchyard and observing the 2 minute silence. We welcomed the Fire Service and learnt about how they help keep us safe and how we can stay safe at home. We have now begun practising for the Nativity and found out what our parts will

We have had a busy and exciting 2 weeks in Beech Class. In computing, year 2 have been looking at photography and leaning how to take a good photograph on an ipad. It was fun getting action shots! Meanwhile, year 1 have been creating digital art pieces. Last week we made self portraits on

In RE, we went around the school imagining we were Mary and Joseph travelling to Bethlehem form Nazareth. We finally arrived at the stable and read the last part of our story.



Holly Class

In Holly, we have been reading Escape From Pompeii. We've been learning about the daily lives of Romans, what their houses and architecture looked like, what food they ate and what jobs people had. We are basing our next unit of writing on the book and will be writing descriptive short stories.

In maths, we've moved on to multiplication. We have been working hard on times tables all year and it is encouraging to see lots of these facts being applied in lessons. We've been making and drawing arrays to show what multiplication is.

In history, we have been imagining ourselves as Celts. We have created our own village and identities. We will be using these characters to learn more about our key questions – especially focusing on how the Romans changed Britain. The children will be given dramatic scenarios to navigate as the villagers - our first one was planning what to do when our crops failed and the storms started. We discussed invading neighbouring tribes but decided it wasn't worth the risk. We settled on taking the advice of the druids and giving an offering to the river. In RE, we've been learning about Noah and the promise he had with God. We've created art to represent the story and we've discussed how Noah might have felt throughout the story – when he might have doubted, when he might have felt fortunate and when he might have felt sad.

Silver Birch Class

Silver Birch have had an amazing start to the second half term. We



have started to talk Christmas! We have continued to be able to use our characteristics of Friends and Team Players through several activities. One being our brilliant trip to Plumpton College. We split into two groups; one group prepared our lunch whilst the other group visited the animals on the farm.

We then swapped and the group cooking now prepared the dessert.



The children behaved brilliantly and showed so many skills learned from Chef John last year. The lunch was delicious and one group were lucky enough to see a calf being born!



We have continued to use Shackleton's Journey as our inspiration in English. We have learned more about the dangerous journey and started



writing diaries. We also have written Tanka poems about Remembrance Sunday; ask your child what this is! We went on a walk to the Bolney War Memorial and held our 2 minute silence

In maths, we have been started to look at addition and subtraction in more detail. We also worked through some of the arithmetic paper questions to discuss efficient methods.

In Science we will be moving onto Evolution and Inheritance. This links nicely to R.E where we discussed this big question: 'Creation and science: conflicting or complementary?' One species we will be finding out more about is the Peppered Moth.
