

Dear parents and carers,

We have been really impressed with the children's zest for learning so far this term. The children have also been showing our values really well and the Year 6's have responded to their leadership roles with great enthusiasm.

Willow Class

We have been busy writing about people who are very special to us. In Year 1 maths we have been using symbols to show which number is greater and lesser and ordering numbers too. In maths in Year R we have reading numbers, counting and practiced writing numbers. In science we have been sorting fruits and vegetables, suggesting how we could do it.



In music we have all been playing untuned percussion to a beat while singing songs like The Grand Old Duke of York and Hickory Dickory Dock.

Beech Class

In English we have starting writing fact files about ourselves. We discussed what we would be famous for. In spelling we have explored 'ey' and 'ay' words as well as revisiting polysyllabic words and homophones. The children are doing brilliantly because of the continued support

at home, thank you. In maths we have completed tasks that involve reasoning, addition and subtraction, place value and problem solving as well as comparing numbers using greater than, less than and equal to language. In science we have been carrying out an investigation of eye colour, collecting data and are now ready to display the data in a bar chart. We also looked at how to be safe around our roads. We sketched our face shape in art and added an eye, nose and mouth to make our faces symmetrical.



Holly Class

We have been writing stories based on the book 'Stone Age Boy' focusing on using effective description using our senses. In design technology we have started planning a model Stone Age house in pairs, working out the materials and joins to use. In maths we have been using partitioning to add numbers that bridge a hundred and a thousand (for the Y4s). We are developing our ball skills in PE through football and netball.

Silver Birch Class This week Silver Birch have begun to write their reports based the plot to poison Rameses II. The children are trying to apply their knowledge of different sentence types. They have also listened very carefully to the advice they have been given to improve. In maths, the children have focused on showing their reasoning by 'diving deeper'. To do this, the children need to select one of the activities from the display to show their understanding of a mathematical concept.

On Tuesday 2nd October we held our Harvest Service in the church. The theme was 'Our Wonderful World' based around colour. We all enjoyed the fantastic singing by everyone and the wonderful performances: singing by Willow class, poems by Beech class, prayers by Holly class and a story and dance by Silver Birch class. KS2 Adventure Day

Out of the four activities of team challenges, archery, bush craft and tree climbing, the bush craft was the favourite. At the end of the day they did a 'Stomp Rocket' competition. The day was funded using our PE and Sport Premium funding following discussions with the children about what else they would like to have the opportunity to do in school.
