Willow

In Willow Class we have read

The Bad Tempered Ladybird by

Eric Carle and thought about



different creatures that could be in the story. We drew and wrote our own page for a class version. We have listened to the Aesop Fable, the Sun and the Wind, and thought about kindness and resilience. In maths Year R have been doubling numbers and Year 1 have been working on place value to 100. We have talked about the features of minibeasts and invented our own minibeasts. We have typed up our Spider fact files using the laptops. We dug up our potatoes. Our caterpillars have turned into chrysalides. We

have predicted how long until they hatch into butterflies and we are very excited about this!

In our topic, Creative Thinkers,

we have made bug hotels using natural materials such as pine cones, grass and leaves. We have



placed them in the quiet area and we will wait and see who moves in! We tried to be as creative as we could! We have been exploring shapes and arrays in maths - not at the same time though! In science we have been sorting minibeasts into groups such as no legs and legs. In English we have finished our minibeast fact files and are now planning our stories about our made up minibeasts. We watched James and the Giant Peach for inspiration!



Holly

Holly class have continued working on their Maya script with Mrs Turner and have moved onto looking at Maya music this week.

for some of us, it was the first
time of trying activities such as
archery and fire lighting.
Cooking – and eating – the
marshmallows seemed a
particular favourite!



We have begun planning our stories ahead of writing them next week and in maths we have focused on multiplication and money problems.

In our Jigsaw lessons, Year 4 have been looking at and talking about the changes that happen to our bodies at puberty and Year 3 have talked about how a baby grows in a womb and what it looks like as it grows...we thought it looked like a baby bird or a dinosaur! We had a giggle today!

Silver Birch

In Silver Birch we have been trying to think outside the box as part of our Change Makers theme. We have looked at the reasons why people are considering eating insects! This

ties in with our class reader 'Beetle Boy' – where we have learned about the incredible variety of insects as well as our focus on climate change – where eating insects is being suggested as a sustainable alternative protein source!



In maths we have been focusing on questioning and extending our learning by asking 'what if?' We have been investigating fractions as this has been a good opportunity to revisit a key area. In geography we have considered the impact of climate change on Bangladesh. We looked at the innovative ways that people around the world are dealing with rising sea levels, floods or other natural disasters. We then imagined becoming government officials tasked with building flood safe villages we designed. We also faced the real life difficulty of prioritisation – as we could not afford all the wonderful suggestions we came up with. We have continued to work hard on our production and it has been lovely to see the enthusiasm and confidence growing - with our lines and song lyrics!
