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## Dear parents and carers,

The children have settled well into their learning and have really enjoyed some exciting events over the past couple of weeks. Here is some news from each class:

#### **Willow Class**

We have started the Incredible Me topic, talking about our bodies, our senses and how we have grown and changed since we were babies. Our Y1 children have been counting and sorting in maths and explaining our reasoning.



We are continuing to help our new Reception children settle by being good role models.



## **Beech Class**

We have been writing stories where we are the main characters because we are incredible. We have been editing, checking our common words and trying extremely hard with handwriting. In maths we have been using Dienes blocks to make two-digit numbers, using part whole

models and tens frames to show different ways of making that number.

In science we have been learning about blood and why we have it. We are also learning how to be safe using our senses.

We have sketched our noses, eyes and mouths ready for our self-portraits. Colour mixing is to come next to find our skin colours.

## **Holly Class**

We kicked off the term with a brilliant trip to Butser Ancient Farm where we learned about Stone Age fence making, pottery, walls and houses and lots more.



In English, we have written fact pages after researching woolly mammoths. In art we have decorated the walls with cave art style paintings.

We have worked on number lines and estimating in maths and in science we had lots of fun learning about the digestive system (in as much disgusting detail as possible!)



#### Silver Birch Class

Last Monday, Silver Birch had a visit from The History Man. He gave the class the opportunity to

explore Egyptian history for themselves which included: role playing as a pharaoh, mummifying each other and playing games that were played at the time.



The children said they learnt so much and they will be using this information to help them solve the mystery of who is trying to poison Rameses II in our English text 'Pharaoh's Fate.'



#### Lego Coding workshop

Last Tuesday the children in Y1 to Y6 had a fabulous workshop using Lego and coding.



They designed fairground rides using Lego and then used the coding software to make the rides move, light up and create sounds. The children were so engaged and really enjoyed the challenges they were set.



Nick, the expert who led the sessions was very complementary about how well the children listened, applied themselves and behaved.
