Willow

Willow Class have been busy this week. Year R children have been writing pirate messages in bottles for their year 6 buddies to read and year 1 children have been finishing their pirate stories and writing out work in best. In maths year 1 have been focusing on place value to 100 and year R have been writing addition calculations based on smarties! We learnt about pirate food and drink. We have been finding out about famous pirates. We made pirate grog (no rum)! We loved the summer prayer space!



I popped into Willow class this afternoon and the children were very excited to show me a video of their music performance. They have been working on this with Mrs Bohm who had recorded a rehearsal for the children to watch so they could suggest improvements. Beech

Beech Class have been writing poems about things that could have been found in a pirate's pocket. We have also started writing diaries from the point of view of a child that finds themselves on a ship. We have talked about first person, past tense and keeping it factual using our topic lessons to help us. In maths we have been exploring 2D and 3D shapes. We found that 3D shapes have 2D shapes on them! We have been making shapes using different resources and then having a go at drawing them.

We played the glockenspiels in music along the song we have been learning 'I wanna play in a band'. In science we investigated how soil and compost help plants to grow. We found out that the best soil is loam soil. We also took part in our Prayer Space in the quiet area of the playground. There were lovely activities and the children were engaged



Wall of Prayers

In researching their BIG question 'How do Jewish people show they belong to God and each other?', Beech class have been finding out about the Western Wall in Jerusalem. Last week we read and acted out the Hanukkah story and discussed the miracles that God performed. We learned that the temple in Jerusalem was destroyed twice - once by the

Greeks and once by the Romans - and that the Western Wall is all that remains. Jews and non-Jews. from all over the world visit the Western Wall to pray and meditate. It is customary to write short prayers on pieces of paper and leave them in the crevices of the wall. Today we wrote our prayers and hopes for the future and tucked them into the cracks of one of our oldest walls. Following on from yesterday's prayer space, it was good to be able to recognise similarities between religions and many of the children's prayers today contained a world vision of working to make the world a better place.



Holly

In Holly we have been focusing on multiplication and division. We have been investigating factors in Year 4 and investigating patterns with multiplication in Year 3. Year 3s explored what happens to the answers when you multiply a number by itself e.g. 10 x 10 and then change one factor to one more and the other factor to one less e.g. 9 x 11 then 8 x 12. Year 4s found factors and recapped area and perimeter when designing different sweet boxes. In English we have been researching and writing up information about chocolate as part of our Maya topic. We have

rewritten recipes to make them sound clear and appealing and researched the origin of chocolate. We have also been busy preparing our packaging for our upcoming brownie sale! In PE, we had a class handball tournament, where we learned the rules of what was a new sport for many of us. We then had a mini league competition which was won by the pink team!

Silver Birch

Over the last couple of weeks, the children have completed their writing portfolios. They are immensely proud of the finished products and were given time to reflect on the progress that they have made throughout the year. It will be certainly be something they will treasure for the rest of their lives. The class are in full rehearsal mode for our performance of 'Joseph' and they are really pushing themselves with their acting and their singing. In our topic work, the children have begun their research projects based on their chosen 'Hall of Fame' person. We have revisited how to conduct effective research and the children will use this to create a piece of work based on their chosen person next week.

Sports Morning

We had a fabulous sports morning. The children were amazing, we had fantastic support from family and friends and the sun shone! Thanks to Mr Pitt's and Mrs Green's brilliant organisation we enjoyed lots of races and field events. The final scores were very close with only one point between each house with Uppark winning the Sports Cup.



A big thank-you to the sports leaders from Warden Park Academy as they were a great help. And a big thank-you to the Friends of Bolney for organising refreshments, including ice lollies for all the children, and to Beacon Fencing Ltd for their kind donation for the refreshments.

Each class visited for an hour and journeyed in small groups, rotating round the following five activities: Leaf rubbing - recognising all that we have to be thankful for; sand and water encouraging us to say sorry and forgive; Mr Glew's 'Bolney Ocean' - praying for the future and our hopes to be heard; mirror reflection - looking at the world God has created; and planting wildflower seeds- thinking about the fruits of the spirit and sharing our needs with God.
