Dear families,
It has been a challenging two weeks with regards the weather but the children have done very well adapting to changes at playtimes. Wellies have been very much appreciated in order for the children to be able to get outside for much needed fresh air!

The children have continued to consider the Wows and Ows of life and the golden glue that holds us together and makes our cracks unique and special. Do ask your child about this at home!

Willow Class

In Willow Class, we have talked about what a superhero is and does and chosen superhero onomatopoeic words and decorated them. We talked about our chosen superhero powers and have designed and begun making our own superhero masks. We have shared more superhero stories like Zog and Supertato. We have drawn Zog, drew his school, designed goggles to help him when he's flying, thought of things that we can do to help people and drew a story map to retell the story. In Supertato we have drawn a character that has gone missing in the story and drawn the supermarket where the story is set. We have imagined what could happen if Evil Pea escaped from the Supermarket and helped him write an apology note. In maths, we talked about measures like capacity odds and evens. In PE, we enjoyed a whole morning of PE and drama this Thursday, including an obstacle

course, circuit training, fine motor skills activities and using our imagination. We have also danced like Superheroes.



In Learning for Life, we talked about challenges we have faced and what helps and who helps us. We have also talked about challenges we'd like to set for ourselves.

Beech Class

We have had a fantastic time in Beech Class this week. We finally finished our woodland fact files! We are so excited to bring them home to show our friends and family all we have learnt about woodland creatures. In Learning for life, we played different team games. Before we started, we spoke about the type of language we could use such as 'try again' or 'would you like some help?'. This helped us be helpful team mates.



In music, we have been learning a new song – in the sea. It has been fun to experiment with tempo. We sung the song very slow and then very fast. We have especially liked the warm up in

music. Ask us to sing 'pop it on the head with a ping pong ball'!

In English, the class have been busy researching facts about different weather phenomenons and have found out some really interesting information which they are presenting in their own way.

Scratch computing sessions are proving very popular and the children are becoming very proficient in creating their own sprite adventures.

In Maths, the children have been enjoyed finding the area and perimeter of their own names this week.

SENDCO update

PACE

All children have looked at PACE in Worship recently and how we can use this model to help support each other in school. PACE is an approach developed by Dr Dan Hughes, an American psychologist. PACE stands for Playfulness, Acceptance, Curiosity and Empathy. These principles help to promote the experience of safety in adult's interactions with young people. Children need to feel that you have connected with the emotional part of their brain before they can engage the thoughtful, articulate, problem solving areas.
