This week has been 'My Money Week' in school. Each class has had a big question to explore and Mrs Burton has led four assemblies looking at four different values: justice, wisdom, generosity and thankfulness. The children have been really thinking hard and asking such fantastic questions. It has been a pleasure to hear what they have been saying.

Willow

Over the last 2 weeks we have been dancing like pirates and writing about half term holidays. The year 1s have been editing their writing to improve it. Last week we were doubling and halving in maths. The year 1s were also finding quarters too.



This week has been My Money week in maths. We have been talking about what we do and don't need money for, the things we value, need and want, what we'd like to buy and why and whether we can afford it! We have been practising our jumping, throwing and running ready for Sports Day next week. We have read Plunge into the Pirate Pool, concentrating on where the story was set, what the character Albie was like and new vocabulary.

Beech

Beech Class have been continuing to write our pirate stories and trying to include some pirate language in them such as 'Ahoy there me hearties!'. In maths we have continued learning how to tell the time looking at quarter to and quarter past. This week we have been taking part in My Money Week and Beech Class were given the question of 'How does our money help other people?'



The children have spent time discussing this and the four values attached to it. We discussed Fairtrade and how we can help others without giving money through giving time and support.



We painted our volcanoes in D.T.!

Holly

In Holly we have been writing descriptions and poems about the book 'Black Dog' by Levi Pinfold. We discussed the metaphors for fear throughout the text and how we could create tense and scary descriptions of the beast. We then wrote descriptive poems incorporating this imagery. In science, we became

archaeologists! We were given the measurements of various bones found at a dig. We then had to work out as much as we could about them – estimating the height, gender and age of the skeletons from what we know about the skeletal system.



We had to measure each other to prove our predictions right or wrong.

In maths we have been focusing on jobs. We've looked at what skills you need, what you can expect to earn in various jobs and whether money is the most important part of choosing a career.

Silver Birch

As part of 'My Money Week', Silver Birch have been looking at what is involved when borrowing money and the impact of being in debt. We have explored loans and mortgages before coming up with weekly budgets. In groups, the children created a piece of drama of a loan application meeting at the bank.



The children were able to justify that, after their budgeting, that they could afford the monthly repayments and were keen to keep the time they took to pay it back to as little as possible to reduce the amount of interest they would be paying. In English, the children have been continuing to build their writing portfolios. When doing this, the children have revisited previous pieces of writing and edited them before creating a neat copy. Once this is done, they then write a short evaluation to explain how the changes they have made have enhanced their pieces further and how that has an impact on the reader. We are hoping to share these with other classes once they are completed.

BookTrust Pyjama Day

We really enjoyed being in our pyjamas last Friday to promote reading at bedtime. The teachers swapped classes to read to a different class, we read together in house teams and when the bell rang we all stopped and read.



Yvrose, from Hope House in Haiti, was visiting us that morning and so loved reading with children.



We all decided that you are never too old to be read to!

Prayer Pilgrimage
