Willow Class

This week we have been looking at non-fiction books and reading about the Great Fire of London. We have begun writing our own books and thought about who our audience is. We talked about who our books are for. Year R and 1 have both been working on subtraction, acting out stories to explain amounts getting smaller.



Year 1 have also been writing subtraction number sentences. In science we have been exploring our classroom, looking for different materials and investigating magnets.

Beech Class

In English we have acted as the characters Vlad and Boxton from our text, 'Vlad and the Great Fire of London'. We started writing diaries after talking about features such as first person, chronological order and including emotion. Spelling has been revising soft c and soft g and common exception words.

In maths we have been talking about inverse and why we use it. Also fact families where numbers are related (6+7=13, 7+6=13, 13-6=7, 13-7=6).

Using the inverse to check our calculations We answered silly questions like 'Should a sink be made out of cloth?' in science. We discussed why this would be suitable or unsuitable. In P.E. we have continued our dance of the Great Fire using props and practised moving into a space in netball. We have added colour to the eyes and the mouth on our portraits.

Holly Class

This week we have been multiplying and dividing by 10,100 and 1000. We have been using counters and 'jumps'. We have also worked on unknown times tables by using known facts and arrays. In English, we have used the Greenpeace's 'There's a Rang-Tan in my bedroom' video as a stimulus for discussion and links to our key text 'The Wilderness War'. We have also written story starts from the point of view of the orangutan. Our Stone Age houses are coming together – after a few hairy moments with collapsing roofs and cracking clay - we are now starting to add finishing touches.



Silver Birch Class

This week in maths Y6 have been continuing to build up their knowledge of how to calculate with fractions by looking at multiplying and dividing fractions and how these can be represented in problems. Y5 have worked extremely hard on finding perimeter of compound shapes and what to do if all the sides are not labelled.

In English and history we have been uncovering Tutankhamun's tomb and the story of Howard Carter's discovery. The children have been captivated by pictures of the treasures within and have been producing their own information text all about the discovery of the boy king's tomb. In science the children have been consolidating their understanding of the human body by developing their own Healthy Living leaflet. There is a two week programme of healthy eating and fitness routines (developed during PE time) that hopefully anyone can follow!

It has been a very productive week with some fabulous Egyptian Art in the pipeline too.

This was a very special thing to be involved in and it helped the children understand the importance of remembering and showing respect.

It also helps them to develop resilience, one of our key values. The children have written some excellent motivational phrases to help each other which we are keen to share with everyone.
