This week we have been learning about soft c words again. Words that have a 'c' but sound like an 's'. Usually, a cor g sound is hard or soft depending on the vowel that follows it. Here's the general rule: When corg meets $a, o, o r u$, its sound is hard. When corg meets e, i, or y, its sound is soft.

Examples of words: face, pencil, once, circle, icy
