This week we have been learning about soft c words again. Words that have a 'c' but sound like an 's'. Usually, a **c** or g sound is hard or **soft** depending on the vowel that follows it. Here's the general **rule**: When **c** or g meets a, o, or u, its sound is hard. When **c** or g meets e, i, or y, its sound is **soft**.

Examples of words: face, pencil, once, circle, icy

Please look for examples of these words in your reading books and write some down. Write a silly story using some of the words. Use conjunctions (because, when, so, and, but).
