The children have shown fantastic learning behaviours, they are so keen to 'have a go' and being positive when they get stuck as they know they will learn even more this way.

Willow Class

Last week we were reading the book 'Pumpkin Soup' so we made pumpkin soup with a pumpkin we grew in our garden, it was delicious. On Monday we loved working with the Rainbow Theatre to act out The Great Fire of London. This week we celebrated Diwali by making rice pudding and finding out about how Diwali is celebrated. We have coloured Rangoli patterns and written the story of Rama and Sita. In maths we have been adding to 5 and beyond (in year R) and been practising number bonds to 10 (in year 1).



Beech Class

This week we have been editing lots of our writing, learning about Diwali, learning about fact families in maths using our number bonds to 20 and beyond. We made poppies, learned about Remembrance Sunday and we tried to remember special times in our lives. Rainbow Theatre came on Monday afternoon and we acted out the story of the Great Fire of London. Our costumes

looked fantastic. We also made a tasty pumpkin soup last week.



Holly Class

We have been researching Stonehenge, looking at how it was made as well as looking into all the strange theories about what it was built for. We have also continued reading 'The Wilderness War' and have been inferring and referring to the story to explain our opinions. In maths we have been problem solving using the inverse to help us check our answers. The most exciting part of our week however has been building our Stone Age houses. We have used clay to build a base and raffia and lolly sticks to start a wattle and daub wall! In science we have begun to look at balanced diets and what benefits the different food groups provide for the body. In PE we are developing our netball and basketball skills.



Silver Birch Class

To mark the centenary of the end of World War I, Silver Birch have composed their own war poems. The children were allowed to

choose whose perspective they would like to write from. This ranged from soldiers, nurses, children and even some of the soldiers that sadly died. After exploring figurative and emotive vocabulary earlier in the unit, the children drafted, edited, improved and published their poems all in one day! The work that has been produced is incredible and the children are very proud of themselves. In maths, the Year 5s have been consolidating their knowledge of the grid method and some have even have moved on to multiplying using decimals. The Year 6s have begun their fractions unit and have been looking at the use of diagrams to prove their answers are correct.

Poppies in the church

Last week every child made a poppy to add to the war memorial in the church. Each child added their poppy to the memorial with such reverence and respect it was very moving. On Tuesday we joined the Reverend Ruth for worship in the church which was about remembering and World War One. We heard about how each soldier was sent a little book of St John's Gospel and we were all delighted when Reverend Ruth gave everyone their own little book of St John's Gospel along with a book about Christmas in the war in 1914 to treasure.
