#### Willow Class

We retold the story and had fun acting it out. We put the story events in order and retold the story out loud. We have been discovering number bonds to 10 and used the number bonds

### **Beech Class**

For Safer Internet Day we created stories on the iPads using Adobe Spark Video and Scratch Junior. The message in the stories had to portray how to be safe online through a variety of different ways. Our focus was on personal

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information and identity. We enjoyed reading DigiDuck and his famous friend story which led us to discuss our own identity online. We explored what we should share and what we shouldn't share online.

We received an exciting letter from a cat called Banjo Robinson who is travelling around the world and would like to send us letters from everywhere he visits but in return we have to leave him letters and pictures and other things we think he would like. In maths we have been exploring division and equal groups. The children have been using a variety of equipment and drawing pictures to solve division problems. We also made some Huff Puff cakes where we had to

measure ingredients and follow a recipe taken from Mr Wolf and the Three Bears. We realised




that there was so much maths in this activity!

In art we started to look at Haiti Steelworks. Thankfully Mrs Glew had an amazing collection for us to look at, inspiring us to start ours after half term.

### **Holly Class**

We have finished writing our character diaries based on Journey. We have continued reading Kensuke's Kingdom and we are currently trying to figure out why Kensuke is being so hostile to Michael whilst still helping him and giving him food! In maths, we are approaching the end of our huge fractions unit.



Year 3 have focused on finding

fractions of amounts, using cubes, counters and times tables knowledge to help. Year 4 have



found fractions of amounts where the numerator is greater than one and have also reasoned to find fractions of tangram puzzles. We all agreed that using bar models helped us with organising the steps involved. In music we have begun learning our new song 'Three Little Birds' by Bob Marley. All the children immediately recognised it and we discussed why the themes and music have made it such an enduring hit with all ages. For Safer Internet Day we discussed the issues we face when dealing with conflicts or nasty behaviour online. We considered how to protect



ourselves and our information and what to do when something online is troubling us. The children

have used Adobe Spark to create helpful videos featuring the sorts of scenarios we have discussed. There was plenty of creativity and fantastic acting on display!

### **Silver Birch Class**

The children have continued to enjoy their topic and have begun researching more about life during The Blitz in preparation for writing handbooks for surviving in London during this unsettled time. Before this, each child performed and recorded their wartime speeches. In maths, we have focused on circles making sure that we are using the correct vocabulary such as: radius, diameter, circumference and midpoint. The children then used a pair of compasses to construct circles with specific criteria. We have now finished our science unit based on space. It is quite safe to say that our minds are suitably blown by the sheer size of the universe. Most recently, the children researched data about the different planets before presenting it in a graph. As part of Safer Internet Day, the children discussed their identity and how they present online. We have also explored using 'Do Ink' (a green screen app) to present the discussions that took place.
