habitats and describing their homes using scientific vocabulary. We have also created Bug Hotels, we are about to decorate them and


collect lots of natural materials to go inside. We are looking forward to seeing who will move in! The Year 1's

In maths the Year 2's have been revisiting addition and subtraction within 100 and realized that if we add to 10 this will help us with larger numbers. The Year 1's have also been learning about equal and unequal groups and talking about multiplication and division.

In Holly this week we have finished reading our text 'Rain Player' which features a strong character called Pik who challenges the Rain God -Chac – to a game of Pok-ta-tok in an attempt to save his community form the effects of drought. We discussed Pik's character and tried to put ourselves in his shoes when thinking about whether we would do the same for our community. One child commented that it was worth the risk because if you didn't then the chances are you would die anyway. What do you think makes a good team player? As mathematicians, we have been looking at telling the time and also



our written methods for subtraction. George pointed out that knowing your five times table really helps with telling the time and then used it to read the time – to 5 minute intervals – on an analogue clock. Mrs Turner and Team Holly have continued to work on their project of planning, creating and filming a Mayan play – watch this space!

In Silver Birch we have been rehearsing for our production! We have begun to learn our lines and rehearse as a class and we are also busy learning the song lyrics. As we are unable to have an audience in person to watch it this year we will be record it to share with families at the end of the term. In English we have been researching influential, famous and significant people in order to write biographies. We have chosen people that fit in well with our 'change makers' theme. We have talked about what their achievements are and why they should be remembered. In maths, the year 5s have been focusing on translation, reflection and coordinates. This has been a good opportunity to recap elements of

shape as well as problem solve. The Year 6s have been working on ratio and proportion. In particular we have been trying to use bar models to show what the problem is asking – this has helped us with 'wordy' problems. In art we have continued to use different textures and colours to create birds. They are starting to look brilliant!
