#### **Willow Class**

In Willow we have read the book Yucky Worms about a little girl visiting her grandmother and talking about the importance of worms. We have drawn the grandmother, a worm and added labels to our picture. We read the book Bloom about a beautiful flower and a little girl. We watched an animation, Zahra, about a girl, growing up in a very hot country and trying hard to nurture a tree with very little access to water. We drew both girls and their homes, the tree and flower and wrote a speech bubble.

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In maths we have been counting to 20 and beyond in maths and looking for patterns. We have also been using the language of addition and subtraction. We have recapped all the phonics we have learnt so far and are trying hard with our sentence writing. We have talked about words that are unacceptable at school and how these make us feel and we have agreed rules for allowing toy cars in school. We have painted self portraits and talked about the jobs our families do. We have enjoyed looking at the baby and toddler photos some of us have brought into school and talked about growing. Our Caterpillars are growing we and we have named them; Monster Truck, Miller, Lollipop, Rosie and William.

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In science, we have been looking at natural habitats and

what that looks like for different animals. We see how animals need to adapt to their climates and we discussed how climate change is impacting certain animals such as polar bears and Asian elephants.

## **Holly Class**

In Holly we have continued to focus on the rainforests as part of our key question. We switched from the Amazon to Borneo as we begun to look at orangutans. We researched and read information pages in our VIPERS lessons and then we made our own. We have enjoyed finding out how intelligent they are and we've watched some documentary footage to learn more. We will be continuing our English lessons with the orangutan theme.



In maths, we've been learning decimals. We have mastered fractions and we are increasingly confident applying our equivalent fraction skills to compare tenths and hundredths. This has been a step up in difficulty but the children have shown a great attitude and desire to challenge themselves.

For science, we have begun by recapping parts of a plant and their function. We are going to learn the parts of the flower next.



Sports Day preparations have continued and there has been a good progression in our shot put and howler throwing. We have practised long distance running as well as relays and sprint starts. In RE we are learning about the Pentecost. The children have recalled details from our Godly Play calendar work earlier in the year as well as making good links to the Stations of The Cross work and Easter story from last half term. For art, we have designed new insects that could be at home in the rainforest. This will also inspire some writing in a few weeks!

#### **Silver Birch Class**

In English, we have completed our unit of writing about Birthday Boy and have started our new text 'The Arrival', a wordless picture book. So far, we have used colour to describe emotion in the illustrations and will be writing a farewell letter next week.

In maths, the Year 5's have been completing their area work and moved onto line graphs and timetables. The Year 6's completed their area, perimeter and volume work to pie charts and statistics to SATs! They have worked hard and we are looking forward to learning about Shape and Algebra next. Another fun activity was to use pictures in maths and so the children had to choose from a range and find the maths. They could find patterns, ratio, shapes, use all four operations and it highlighted that maths is all around us.

In computing, we have continued to look at Excel and we have used the AutoSum function to add data for us. We can see the importance of using spreadsheets particularly from the maths that we have been doing.

Science has been about mammals and reproduction. We learned about asexual, sexual and gametes. The children had some images of the process of reproduction and had to write their own description. We will be learning about Jane Goodall this week. In learning for life, we have continued with Puzzle 4 and this weeks' discussion was about asking for help and what being exploited meant. We also discussed drugs (prescribed and unprescribed).

Another amazing event we were lucky to partake in, was a visit from Natalia, a Ukrainian refugee, staying in Bolney. We had given Mrs Glew (Mary, Natalia's sponsor is Mrs Glew's neighbour) some questions and Natalia came in to share her responses.



It was very emotional. We shared our art books to show how we have considered displacement in our school.



#### **Hotline to Heaven**

Each week we have a theme in worship and Mrs Glew creates a beautiful interactive reflection area for the children to visit. She also runs our very popular hotline to Heaven lunchtime club. Can you spot the themes?
