What a joy it has been to complete the spring term with us all together. We look forward to, what we hope is an uninterrupted summer term!

Willow

In Willow Class we have finished our Change Makers topic by thinking of what changes we would make to make the world a better place and what we can do to make this happen! Year 1 have been measuring weight and length and Year R have been adding 2 numbers together. In our Jigsaw sessions we have talked about how we feel when things are tricky and how we face obstacles. We loved visiting the church and this concluded our RE work about placing crosses in an Easter Garden. We have built our own Easter Garden and added our own crosses.



Beech

Beech Class have had a busy couple of weeks. We have been making a Woodland scene out of clay. We used many different materials to mark make, create patterns and used slip to join pieces together. In RE we also used plasticine to make any object relating to Easter. The children were only given a coinsized piece of plasticine and had to make as many objects as possible. We had hot cross buns, bunnies, crosses and spring flowers. In science we have been making our own paint using natural

materials. The children loved seeing that it was a success! In our Jigsaw lessons we have been setting goals and working towards them. Some of us have learned the Macarena dance, learning to count in two's in French and making cards. We have had to work as a team, show resilience and know how to work out the steps to reach the goal. In music we listened to Debussy's Claire De Lune and used watercolours to paint the pictures it created.

Holly

We have been incredibly busy in Holly Class over the last couple of weeks! We have now completed our shape unit in maths which concluded with the children making structures out of art straws. As a class, they came up with their own criteria of what must be included and then were scored on the content as well as their artistic impression. The children were certainly very proud of what they had achieved.



In English, the children have created their own animals that they thought might exist in 50 million

years' time, gone on spelling scavenger hunts and managed to write some superb writing that explores character's feelings. It has also been lovely to see how proud the children are of their work because they have been so desperate to read it out in class! Most recently, the class made crosses out of Mrs Harvev's Christmas tree! The children discovered that it helped symbolize Jesus's death. The class has placed a larger cross in the entrance of the church and invite people to leave jars of flowers around it.



Silver Birch

In Silver Birch we have been learning about how the Viking and Anglo Saxon communities interacted, fought, settled and shaped Britain. We debated how Ethelred II should have dealt with the 'Viking problem' - using violence, alliances or by converting the Vikings to Christianity! The children debated really well – we focused on listening to others, building on their points or challenging them courteously. All the children could make a point, listen to others and consider differing opinions before reaching a conclusion themselves.

We also learned about the fight for the throne after the death of Edward the Confessor. We learned why Harold, Harald and William all wanted to be King and how these events led up to the Battle of Hastings. We have written reports about the contenders and included some gory facts about the battles. In maths we have investigated shape! We tried to find all the possible nets for a cube (there are 11!) and Year 5 also tried to spot the link between the number of faces and vertices of 3D shapes and how that helps us with the number of edges.

We have continued to build our marble ramps in science – and had to show lots of resilience to fix problems and tinker with them until things worked!
