

Dear parents and carers,

We have had a very busy and very long half term – it is the longest one in the year. The children and staff have all been amazing and I hope everyone has an enjoyable and safe half term break.

Willow Class

In Willow Class we have been reading The Colour Monster, all about emotions and feelings which helps us to understand ourselves. We have continued with phonics activities; talked about sounds and letter names, capital letters and when to use them. We talked about vowels and consonants and have tried blending sounds into words. Our sounds this week have been g, o, e, c and k. We've looked for words that start with these sounds and tried writing our focus sound correctly. We have been looking for shapes like rectangles, squares, circles and triangles and tried describing them. We have made pictures using shapes.

We're all ready for a well-deserved rest and are all looking forward to our new play area after half term. **Diwali**

A huge, huge thank you to Nanya, Rohan's Mum, for talking to our class about Diwali this week. The children have heard the story of Diwali, of Rama and Sita, and how Diwali is celebrated. They made rangoli patterns with coloured rice and sand. Nanya and Rohan made ghughra for the children and staff, sweets made with coconut and cardamom. We have continued by colouring in rangoli patterns and making rice and diva lamps.



Beech Class

Newsletter

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Beech Class have continued to explore poetry in English. The Year 2's learned how to write a Kenning poem by playing around with nouns and verbs. We wrote Kennings about all sorts of subjects- footballers, penguins and motorbikes!



Year 2 also wrote instructions for how to play and build our dolls house. We discussed

imperative verbs (bossy verbs) and the use of command type sentences. The children have loved playing with

the doll's house and making furniture and characters. The Year 1's have been tinkering on iPads using the app, Puppet Pals. The children

had to create a scene, two characters and record a conversation between the two characters. They then tried to design a comic strip using their characters they had made for the doll's house.

In maths we have been continuing to use our place value knowledge to move into adding numbers and recalling number facts within 100. We have used our maths eyes to find maths inside pictures, investigated rules and designed our own Rangoli patterns using shapes and symmetry. In Character Matters we have been talking about how we encourage each other in different ways. Encouragement can lead to resilience because we have support to achieve our goals. In science we carried out an investigation using different materials to find out which material is best for muffling sound. We found out that the bubble wrap is pretty good!



Holly Class

This week we have been learning about Diwali. We read the story and discussed the meaning and its importance to Hindus. We then rewrote the story to retell it to Beech class. The children worked so hard to consider how to make it an exciting story for the other children, they also drew pictures and made picture cards for the younger children to order.



We continued the Diwali theme by making lanterns – light being the key theme of the story. Remember to put any candles in a glass before placing them in your lantern! In PE we worked on pivoting and combining movements in netball games. In DT we have begun to design mosaic tiles. In maths we investigated multiplication; using multilink to make 'stairs' and considering what the differences were between different size 'stairs'. We even rearranged the stairs to make squares - thus learning why 4 x 4 and 5 x 5 etc are called square numbers!

Silver Birch Class

Over the last two weeks, we have been exploring poetry. The children have written some amazing poems based on the sinking of the Titanic. They were given some options of different perspectives: passengers that were lucky enough to escape on a lifeboat, passengers left on board the ship and for a real challenge, written in the first person from the ship's point of view. As they were writing, the children were clear in how they wanted the reader to feel so made sure that they selected phrases



and sentence structures to support this. In maths, we have now come to the end of calculations. We have covered a range of different methods: grid method for multiplication, expanded column method for multiplication, bus stop and chunking for division. The children confidently applied these methods to a range of different word problems. In science, the children have written in role as an electron to explain to others what happens when a circuit is complete. This was a brilliant opportunity for the children to showcase all that they had learnt over the half term. We have also been designing our own SOS messages using buzzers based on the SOS messages that were sent the night the Titanic sank.

Thank-you

We are delighted that the children who were poorly in Silver Birch following their residential trip are now all back at school with rosy faces. Thank-you to everyone for following the additional precautions we put in place, we are so pleased that there has been no spread of the E.Coli bug in school. The source of the E.Coli is still being investigated by Public Health England. Over the half term the school is having a 'deep clean' just to be extra safe.

It is imperative that any child who has sickness or diarrhoea must by symptom free for 48 hours before returning to school. This is so key in preventing any bacteria being spread. We will continue with the good handwashing, please continue to promote this at home as well. Thank-you again for your support with this.
