As a parent/carer I will:

- © accept the school's aims and Christian values and, having chosen this school for my child, positively support the school.
- © let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect my child's learning or behaviour.
- © make sure my child attends school each day, ready to start learning at 9.00am; children are able to come into school from 8.45am.
- © support the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour and learning (we can give you copies of these policies if you would like to see them).
- © set a good example to my own and other children when on school premises.
- © treat school staff with respect, refraining from physical and verbal abuse.
- send my child to school in the school uniform which is named, (details can be found on the school website), along with a water bottle and ensure their PE kit is in school every day.
- © support and encourage the completion of home learning by my child within the allocated time.
- attend parents' evenings and discussions about my child's progress.
- when possible, attend information evenings and workshops provided by the school.
- © read all information sent home as this gives me important details of relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, news and events.
- aim for my child's attendance to not drop below 96% and aim to avoid term time holidays.
- onotify the school by 9.30am if my child is absent on the first day of absence.
- © collect my child on time at the end of their school day or make alternative arrangements including informing the school in writing (by letter or email) if my child is walking home without an adult.
- © keep school informed of my up-to-date contact details in case of an emergency, providing at least four contacts with alternative numbers.
