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Willow Class

In Willow Class, we have been finishing our sea creature factfiles. We read the Lighthouse Keepers Lunch and planned the lunch we would like to pack and also worked out how to transport our picnic safely. We have designed the sandwiches we would like to bring to our own Teddy Bears picnic.

In Maths, we have been making our own patterns and explaining our pattern rules and describing position and direction. We have recapped all the phonics we have learnt so far. We have been talking about foods and whether they're healthy or unhealthy choices. We have been painting sunflowers from observation and added more detail to these. We have learned more about David Attenborough and about plastic waste in the Oceans. We have talked about the jobs we'd like to do when we get older.

Holly Class

In Holly, we received a very exciting response from our MP, Alison Bennett. She responded to our questions about environmental protection and was full of praise for the children's consideration and care for an important issue. In maths, we have been learning about shapes. We started with angles and turns, mastering the language and using it to describe 2D shapes and their differences. We also constructed prisms and pyramids using straws.





For computing, we've finished our unit on image editing. The children have applied all their skills – removing and duplicating parts, changing filters and colour and copying and pasting to create new images. We finished by creating weird new creatures by blending animals. In our PE lessons, we have been playing rounders. We have learned a lot more about the strategy in the game and we are much more confident talking with teammates to field more efficiently and to know when to run and when to stay. In science, we've been focusing on germination and seed dispersal. We discussed how seeds travel and talked about the different trees and plants we know of and how their seeds are dispersed. We also finished our flower creations in art.

Silver Birch Class

We can't believe we are at the end of our summer term and this is the last newsletter. In English, we have been writing diaries from the point of view of Shif, Bini, Shif's mother, a prisoner at the container or a guard based on our brilliant text Boy 87.
