Class learning Willow

It has been a busy month in Willow. Year R have learnt a Harvest Poem and are practising reading and writing numbers 1-10 and counting objects to 5, to 10 and beyond. Our Happily Ever After topic is drawing to a close. Year 1 have written their own apple poem and have been designing imaginary castles.



They have also been sorting objects by the materials they are made from. In circle time we have talked about good and bad choices and the consequences of our actions. In maths we have been using number lines and using a part-whole model diagram to represent addition.



Beech

Beech Class have been enjoying applying for jobs in a castle. We wrote letters of application to Lady James and Lady Halliwell. We

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interviewed each other for jobs such as: carpenter, watchman, cook, knight and marshal. We all got the jobs!

Our Paul Klee work is finished and

we have produced some amazing versions that we have called Castle and



Moon rather than Castle and Sun. We investigated colour mixing in science and used our skills of observation noticing patterns and discussing what we found out.



We have been designing our Learning Charter in our Jigsaw sessions and talking about rights, responsibilities, rewards and consequences. This will help us to do the best work we can.

In Holly Class we have continued looking at the digestive system as part of our science unit. The children can very confidently talk about each stage and have learnt a large range of scientific vocabulary - including borborygmus (any guesses?). During one of the lessons, Mrs Burton demonstrated what happened at each stage. To say the children were disgusted (and secretly enjoying every moment!) was an understatement! In art, we have continued looking at portrait work. It has been



impressive seeing how much care and effort the children take when

trying to reproduce a small section of a Tudor portrait -



Hans Holbein would be impressed. Mrs Bridger very confidently demonstrated how we can use lines to make sure that we are drawing a face in proportion. The children were very surprised to hear that our eyes are in fact in the middle of our head not right at the top!

Silver Birch

Silver Birch have been busy reading Pharaoh's Fate about a plot to murder Pharaoh Ramesses II. We have written warning letters, scanned for clues and discussed culprits before writing a report detailing our findings.

In maths we have focused on the 4 calculations, using bar models and diagrams when tackling multi step problems and discussing when to use mental strategies and when to use written methods.

In science we have continued our work on the circulatory system – investigating the effects of different intensity exercises on our heart rate.

We have made our own songs using GarageBand in music, we picked a genre and tried to incorporate different layers of instruments, including drums, guitars, synths and strings.



In topic lessons we have learned about ancient Egyptian farming, techniques and reliance on the river Nile.
