Autumn Term Newsletter November 2020

Dear families,

We seem to be speeding towards the end of term quite quickly with just three weeks left! Everyone continues to do so well, it is so lovely to see the children come to school with such big smiles. As you know, England is coming out of the national lockdown on Wednesday 2nd December and, in West Sussex, we will be going into Tier 2 restrictions. Here at school, our preventative measures remain the same. We ask you to continue to keep your child/ren at home if any household member has any suspected COVID-19 symptoms until a negative test is confirmed along with continuing the social distancing outside the school gate when dropping off and collecting your child/ren. Please leave the school vicinity straight away to leave space for others during the staggered start and end to the school day. Thankyou for helping us keep everyone safe.

Class learning Willow

In Willow we have invented our own superheroes and thought what our powers should be and made masks for them. We read,




learnt and recited the poem If I Was a Superhero. Year 1 also read about extraordinary animal

superheroes with Mrs Harvey. Year R have created and continued patterns in maths and worked on counting to 10, recognising numbers to 10 and writing numbers to 5. Year 1 have worked on number bonds to 10 and addition, concentrating on counting on from one of the numbers rather than starting at zero each time. In our PSHE sessions we have talked about similarities and differences between friends, bullying, what it is and what it is not; that it is repeated, deliberate and is unfair. We have talked about to do if you are worried. In RE we have shared stories of Jesus' miracles before thinking about the birth of Jesus. To help the children make connections between adults and babies they also looked at photos of our staff as babies! We have shared stories about real superheroes, such as Nelson Mandela, Sir David Attenborough and Tamara De Lempicka.

Beech

We have enjoyed our Superheroes topic so far. We have designed our own superheroes and villains. We talked about opposite adjectives like fast and slow as well as using superlatives like small and smallest to describe them. In addition, we have written some information pages about animal superheroes. The children had to research an animal to find out all about its super characteristics.



In art we have been learning about Andy Warhol's Pop Art style. We have taken black and white photos of ourselves and everyday objects ready to add bright colours to create our versions. Also, we have looked at the five patterns in nature and used Andy's Pop Art style to recreate our version of that too! We have been recapping on our number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 finding patterns to help us. We learned about using inverse to check calculations too. In science, we investigated how to make secondary colours using food colouring, water and paper towels! We had to use our prediction and observation skills for this.



The children are enjoying our superhero dance where they are solo dancers, then duo dancers, leading into becoming a superhero squad! We have discussed how it is good to be different in our PSHE sessions and how we can help each other to solve problems.

Holly

During our science sessions, we have begun looking at the different teeth that we have and the reasons why. To show their understanding, the children all successfully created a set of teeth made out of clay - they were incredibly accurate! The



children are able to speak knowledgeably about their creations using the correct scientific vocabulary. In our topic sessions, we have looked carefully at each Tudor monarch, evaluate who we felt was the greatest ruler and justify our reasons with the evidence we have looked at. It is looking like Elizabeth I is winning this due to her grit and determination to see off all kinds of enemies. It has been so wonderful seeing the children's ability to hold discussions develop and how deeply they think of their answers. We will be looking at the Spanish Armada in the coming weeks which the children are incredibly excited about.

Silver Birch

Silver Birch have been writing short stories based on a funny animation featuring a camel and a hidden, moving pyramid. We have also imagined the difficult life of a pyramid builder — discussing how people were called away to work on these projects for years at a time. We are now writing diaries from the perspective of one of these workers. In maths, we have focused on square, cube and prime numbers, finding factors and prime factors, multiples and

using BODMAS to solve problems. In geography we have been focusing on rivers. We have been learning the key vocabulary to describe parts of the river – like source, meander, tributary and confluence. We have also discussed why rivers are so important to humans and why we often choose to settle on floodplains. Our RE unit on pilgrimages has led us to the story of Saint Bernadette, coincidentally her story also involves a river!

Again we ask that **ONLY** parents with pre-school children or a particular need (as discussed with Mrs Kenny) use the car park. Please park at an angle to optimise the space to pass parked cars.
