# Dear parents and carers,

What an amazing term this has been with so much going on, fantastic learning, superb visitors and brilliant help and support from all of our wonderful families. We hope you have a very enjoyable Easter break and look forward to seeing everyone on Tuesday April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

# Willow

We have been writing biographies of Mary Anning, fossil hunter. We used all our dinosaur knowledge to invent our own dinosaurs and describe their features.



In maths year 1 have been measuring and comparing length. Year R have been getting the hang of money and time, ordering events from their daily lives. We finished our *Land Before Time* topic in style, by celebrating our learning with parents on Thursday afternoon.

Next term we'll be finding out more about pirates through our *Walk the Plank* topic.

# Beech

In D.T., science and maths we have designed our volcanoes and decided what materials we would like to use to build it. We had a go at using Mod Roc and paper maché. Also we sorted materials into whether they could be used for the inside or the outside of the volcanoes so we used a Venn diagram to help us do this. We discussed what happens if we want to place materials in both categories and the children understood that we have an overlapping section for this.



In English we have finished our biographies and finished writing our facts based on a fantasy dinosaur. We have had a busy week writing!

In maths we have been revising partitioning using chips and peas (tens and ones), addition using the same equipment and some unfamiliar word problems. We discussed how to explain our thinking and making sure we answer everything clearly.

# Holly

We have been learning to tell the time in year 3. This has been very challenging and the children have shown great resilience and a desire to crack it! The Year 4s have continued focusing on area and solving problems with complex shapes. In English, we have written newspaper reports about the discovery of new species in the Amazon. We used our science lessons to think about what the characteristics the animals would need to survive, acted out the discovery and wrote in the role of reporters. Here's a selection of some of the home learning topic projects.



# Silver Birch

The children have been busy writing their Viking sagas - they are incredible! The class then compared their stories to their Egyptian stories and they were able to see the progress that they have made since the autumn term. In maths, we have been looking at constructing circles. Although, this was a difficult skill to master, the children were able to rise to the challenge and use compasses accurately. The final project of our Viking topic is to create Viking long ships. The children have been researching how they are going to make them float and so far they have created prototypes with sugar paper.

# **Fabulous Visitors**

The children found Alison Lapper inspiring and incredible. She told them about her life as a child and how she learnt to use her mouth and feet. She showed them some

of her art and led painting workshops with some of the children who could only use their mouths or



feet to hold the paintbrush. It was very messy and great fun! We were all so impressed with Alison's attitude to life, how she shows resilience and perseverance and has such a 'can do' approach to everything. Many of the children remembered how Alison said "Impossible isn't a word, the word says I'm possible."

What a fantastic message to give to our wonderful children.

#### Maths workshops

We held two maths workshops for parents this week where Mrs Burton shared the methods we use in school to support addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Parents said that the workshop was extremely helpful to see how equipment and drawing helps support the more formal calculations. # STEM books

On Monday we had visitors from Usborne Books and Roche, the pharmaceutical company, to present us with a number of books to promote children's interest in STEM - Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.
