


Newsletter

This half term has gone by so quickly. We hope you have an enjoyable break over the next week. The children are back in school on **Tuesday 26**th **February**.

Willow

We have continued our dinosaur topic work by 'Dancing with Dinosaurs' in PE. We thought about how the dinosaurs of long ago would have moved across the land and sky.

It was lovely to enjoy the sunshine in our outdoor area today - we even spotted a Red Admiral butterfly whilst digging for worms to make worm soup (they were all safely returned to the soil at the end of the day!).



Recently in RE we have been talking about how we are all precious and that God loves every one of us and that he wants this love to be shared with others to make the world a better place. Today we revisited the golden rule of 'Do for others what you want them to do for you' and thought about what we do to **show** others that we love them. We help others when they fall over, we play with others and we help others when they are stuck with their work are just a few of the things we can do.



Beech

In Beech class we have finished learning about the time line of dinosaurs and we researched the Cretaceous period. In art we have added some real sand to our islands as our coasts and coves.



In English we have written, edited and started to write our stories in neat. In maths we have been exploring fractions- learning about halves, quarters and thirds as well as understanding unequal and equal. In dance we become sea and air dinosaurs, gliding, swooping and diving. In gymnastics we practised rolls and jumps. We shared our fantastic home learning- such an amazing effort from the children!



Holly

This week we have been writing stories, poems and newspaper articles inspired by a picture. This was for a West Sussex writing competition. The children could write whatever they wanted, of whatever genre. We used the book 'Flotsam' by David Wiesner as our inspiration. The children worked really hard to independently plan, draft, edit and top copy their pieces of writing. We are really pleased with their stories. In maths, we have looked at the vocabulary used to describe shapes. We have also looked at angles, drawing and recognising acute, obtuse and right angles as well as estimating the number of degrees in the turn. In topic, we learned about the different biomes across the globe, we researched the regions covered by each biome, as well as some of the plants and animals found there. Our home learning projects were brought in and shared. There was a brilliant range of work on display - all showing great effort, creativity and a love of learning. We really enjoyed sharing and talking about our projects.



Silver Birch

Over the last couple of weeks, the children have drafted, proof read, edited and published their newspaper articles about the Lindisfarne Invasion. Their finished products were typed and they considered their layouts carefully. They all look very professional. This week, the children have also been preparing for West Sussex's Writing Competition. The only brief the children were given was to use a picture as a starting point. There have been a wide range of genres that have been presented and we are really impressed with the quality of the stories. In maths, the Year 5s are still continuing their work on fractions but they have really deepened their understanding of complex ideas. The Year 6s have almost finished their algebra unit and are now confident to solve a range of equations. Once again, we have had some fantastic home learning brought in - though we have come to the conclusion that the children wouldn't make particularly scary Viking warriors!



Sports events Indoor Cricket

Six of our cricketers played in a Mid-Sussex tournament. They played four games and though they did not win any the games the results became closer as they went on. The team played really well and tried very hard and all the cricketers are looking forward to more games in the summer.

Basketball and Badminton

As part of our membership with Mid Sussex Active (a sports partnership that supports schools) we are able to take part in their new festivals. These are designed for children to learn skills in a specific sport that they may not have tried before or played much. We are ensuring that every child in KS2 gets the chance to

represent the school in at least one sporting event over the year so these events really help us to do this. Some year 5 and 6 children played basketball last week and some year 3 and 4 children played badminton this week. All the children really enjoyed it and learnt new skills.



Mrs Harvey shared in assembly today that the Rawson Hall can be hired for Badminton if you fancy a game as a family.

Safer Internet Day

For Safer Internet Day each class completed some activities about permission and consent for using the internet. They explored different scenarios and discussed whether consent was needed for them. There were some fantastic discussions and conversations by the children about their use of the internet. They showed they understood the importance of consent and upper key stage two were very aware of why it is important that there are age limits on some games and films. The British Board of Film Classification's website https://www.bbfc.co.uk is really useful to help choose ageappropriate films, videos and websites.
