Willow

In Willow Class we have read Harry and His Bucketful of Dinosaurs. We described Harry and looked for examples of verbs, nouns and adjectives. We made clay fossils using leaves from the school garden and pressing them into clay. We used the Chatterpix app to take photos of a dinosaur toy and add a voice-over. Year 1 have been adding by counting on and by finding number bonds to 10 and 20. Year R have been finding 6 and 7 objects and practising writing 6 and 7. We talked about the jobs we want to do when we get older and the jobs our families do. We have talked about compromise, this is

the week's theme for worship. We had a visit from the Dinosaur

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Dome and got to handle fossils. I was impressed by the children's behaviour and level of knowledge after just a half term. Year 1 have been learning more phonics Phase 5 ways of writing sounds we already know oy (royal, toys) and ir (stir, swirl). Year R have been learning new Phase 3 sounds ai (pain); ee (deep); ng (song). Please practice these at home.

Beech

Beech class really enjoyed the visit from the Dinosaur Dome! (Many thanks to the FOB for funding this!) We were thrilled to hold fossilized teeth and claws as well as coming face to face with a Velociraptor's skull. We were able to name many dinosaurs and were able to display our impressive knowledge.



In English we have been completing our dinosaur stories as well as our detailed nonfiction reports. We have been using a range of writing skills in each and are feeling very proud of our efforts and results. In maths we have continued to Spring Term Newsletter 18th February 2022

work on efficient methods of addition and subtraction, combining all our learning to help us use the column methods of addition and subtraction. We have also been developing our skills in handling and interpreting data, showing information in tally charts and pictograms.

Holly

We have had a busy couple of weeks. We have been finishing off our states of matter theme in science and we carried out an investigation about evaporation and we then made a comic strip all about the Water Cycle.



In maths we have been continuing to look at efficient methods in multiplication and learning what exchange means. We realized that we need to know and apply our times tables to be confident in this! In English we started to look at our book, 'Flood'. We also watched The Word Collector book being read which is all about a little boy who collects words, plays around with them and then tries to put them in some kind of order. This is what

we have done with the illustrations from Flood. We collected words and then played with them to write poetry. In art we have amazed Mrs Bridger with our landscapes, tornadoes and perspective artwork. We used soft pastels and sketching techniques. In science we watched a weather forecast and learned how to present information in a short time. We had to talk about a topic for one minute without a script or hesitation the children were brilliant and engaged their audiences!

Silver Birch

In Silver Birch we have been writing survival guides for children living through WW2. We have given tips on surviving evacuation, rationing, air raids and shelters. We tried to be informative and helpful without terrifying the reader about the realities of war.

In maths we have been finding unknown angles in triangles, quadrilaterals on straight lines and round a point. We have had to use lots of shape knowledge and solid reasoning to find missing angles.

In RE we have continued to learn about Islam – focusing on the first pillar of Islam - the importance and devotion to Allah. We finally found out why we had to make 100 small boxes - to represent the 99 glorious names of Allah (plus one that only the camels know). We have also looked at calligraphy and practised writing in Arabic. In history we have considered how Dunkirk should be remembered. Should it seen as a turning point that inspired a nation or an avoidable disaster

that could have been a lot worse? We had some interesting discussions. In science we were thrilled to have our experience in the Science Dome. We learned lots about the solar system, space exploration and the exciting future possibilities!
