Dear families,

We have now settled into our daily routine at school and we are finding that the children are able to concentrate for longer periods of time. On Monday (28th) we have an INSET day for staff training so school is closed to children. We are looking forward to Year R staying with us all day from next Thursday.

Class learning Willow

In Willow Class Year R have been busy learning the names of our peers, practising writing our own name and counting up to 10 objects amongst other things. This week we read Freddie and the Fairy! (all about talking clearly) and played games that encouraged turn taking and co-operation. Year 1 have been reading and acting out the story of the Gingerbread Man and writing story plans for the story. In maths we have continued practising writing number words and have been working out 1 more and 1

less. In science we have been sorting materials. In PE we have been working on football skills, trying to control



the ball with different parts of our foot around objects and passing to a friend.

Beech

Beech Class have been enjoying learning about castles. We have found out what materials are used to build them, who lived in them, and the many different parts. The children have enjoyed sharing our text 'Small Knight and George' and we have been drawing and writing

about characters Small Knight could meet and we designed our own dragons. In art we have taken our pencil for a walk just like Paul Klee.





In maths we have explored two digit numbers as well as using number tracks to learn many different number sequences. Our PSHE sessions have been about belonging and feeling welcome in a new class and starting a new year. We also talked about our responsibilities in class and at home.

Holly

Holly class are incredibly excited about their new topic 'The Tudors'. We started by discussing the Battle of Bosworth and held our own reenactment of the battle where Henry Tudor (played by Arthur) was victorious over King Richard III (played by Jessie). We have just started planning our news reports about the battle and will be recording them.



As well as looking at the battle, we have begun looking at the six wives of Henry VIII. This week, we were discussing which wife we felt had the worst situation - there was a lot of divided opinion. In maths, we are continuing to look at place value and have been making the most of

the good weather by learning through active games. Once we have made sure our place value is secure, we will begin revising calculation methods. As part of our science, we have been looking at the digestive system. The children have been very keen to use the correct scientific vocabulary and have begun investigating the different food groups.

Silver Birch

Silver Birch have been learning all about ancient Egypt. We have learned how archaeologists go about excavating tombs and what decisions and difficulties they face when trying to recover precious artefacts. We have also learned lots about the afterlife and how the Egyptians believed a part lion, part crocodile and part hippo beast waited to devour the hearts of those unlucky souls that failed the heart weighing ceremony. In English we have been reading 'Pharaoh's Fate' about a plot to poison Ramesses II. We have written fact pages about the Valley of the Kings where pharaohs were buried and have also begun writing warning letters to Ramesses warning him about the plot and updating him on potential suspects!



In science we have been learning about the circulatory system. We have explored what is in blood – through the medium of fruit cocktails! Raspberries represented the red blood cells for example. Do ask the children if they can remember what the marshmallows, squash and sprinkles represented. In maths we have been focusing on

place value, rounding and addition and subtraction. For music/computing we have started to make our own rock masterpieces using GarageBand!
